July 2017 85th Legislature, 1st Special Session



<u>Find your legislator.</u> You can use the TCCB's <u>map</u> of <u>Catholic schools</u> to find your Texas Senator or Representative. Each legislator's office, phone number, email, and social media contact information can be found through this tool.

<u>Preparation.</u> No matter how you decide to contact your legislator, it's important to think through what you'd like to say. Writing a short letter can help you get your thoughts in order, even if you decide to also call your legislator or contact them on social media.

<u>Be brief.</u> When organizing your thoughts, be brief. Limit any letter to one page.

Introduce yourself. Begin by introducing yourself and your community. For example:

"I am a science teacher at St. John Paul II High School in New Braunfels,"

"I am working mother of two, and I live in Northern San Antonio, which is in your district," or

"My husband and I live in Irving and send our daughter to Notre Dame Catholic School in Dallas."

Be blunt. Follow your introduction with a brief statement, such as, "I'm writing to urge you to support school choice in 2017." Then, start a second paragraph explaining why you support school choice.

Relate it to Home. Help your legislator understand why your position is imporant to you and others in your community. If possible, include a local story illustrating why choosing a school is better than being assigned to a school. You can also explain why you like your Catholic school and why other families should have the opportunity to attend.

<u>Allow for follow-up.</u> Include specific contact information and offer to act as a resource if your legislator or staff have questions or would like more information. Include your address so they know you are a constituent.

<u>Address your letter.</u> When writing to your legislator, use the following at the top of the page:

The Honorable (full name)

Texas (Senate or House of Representatives)

Austin, Texas 78701

Dear (Senator/Representative) (full name),

<u>Sign your letter.</u> At the end of your letter, choose a formal salutation like, "Sincerely," then sign your name.

<u>Call, Message, or Tweet.</u> You are welcome to call your legislator or contact them on social media! Their phone number, Facebook, and Twitter are listed on TCCB's <u>map of Catholic schools</u> to help you easily get in touch with them.
