WHEN APPLYING FOR THE TEXAS EDUCATION ACCOUNT (TEFA) PROGRAM, ONE OF THE QUESTIONS YOU'LL SEE ASKS WHETHER YOUR CHILD QUALIFIES FOR SPECIAL EDUCATION SERVICES IN A PUBLIC SCHOOL.

- A TEFA Disability Certification Form approved by the Texas Comptroller found under (<https://educationfreedom.texas.gov/>)
- A Full and Individual Initial Evaluation (FIIIE) from a public school ISD
- A current Texas IEP (Individualized Education Program)
- An out-of-state IEP

QUICK CHECKLIST FOR PARENTS

- ✓ My child has one of the 13 qualifying diagnoses
- ✓ I have an approved certification, FIIIE or IEP
- ✓ My child has an IEP from 2023-24 or later
- ✓ I contacted my ISD to upload the IEP to APEX
- ✓ I selected "Yes" to the special education question on the TEFA application
